They've slept on the couches of friends, slept in their car, but when a family comes to Carpenter's Shelter, that is when they are finally able to breathe a sigh of relief.

Congratulations to these three friends for "Shaking the Keys"! The trio decided to become roommates together in Arlington, VA to be able to afford rent. The biggest challenge was being on a fixed income as seniors and getting their documents together to apply for the Rapid Re-Housing program, but they did it!

Neil\* was born and raised in Alexandria, VA. He became homeless after he could not keep up with the rapidly increasing cost of rent while being on a fixed income. Neil spent some time sleeping on the couch at a friend's house until his friend became hospitalized. He decided to come to Alexandria Community Shelter (ACS) because at that point he had nowhere else to go. While in shelter, Neil was always quick to help others.

Jennifer\* came to Carpenter's Shelter from Florida. She was a retired nurse who became homeless after her relatives sold their family home.

Matt\* arrived to the shelter from Arizona. When Matt first came to the shelter after getting transferred from a hospital, he was extremely nervous, but he reported that Carpenter's Shelter staff were always kind to him. Matt did not have any family or emergency contacts to report when he arrived.

Neil, Jennifer and Matt slowly became good friends over the months at the shelter. Matt is a social person and does not like to be alone, so he thought a roommate situation would be exactly what he needed. He proposed the idea to his friends, and they agreed.

This was a unique way to get three individuals housed affordably and much quicker.
